

**H. CLARENCE WHAITE
PRESIDENT**

Royal Cambrian Academy of Art, 1885—1912

Centenary of H. Clarence Whaite.

THIS year being the Centenary of the birth of the artist, Mr. H. Clarence Whaite, the Council of the Academy thought it fitting to recognise the occasion by introducing into the Exhibition two representative works by him, and these are "Snowdon," an important oil painting (No. 207 in the Catalogue), and a water colour drawing, "Roman Bridge," (No. 280 in the Catalogue), both of which have been kindly loaned by the owners, the Trustees of the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff..

Mr. Whaite was for a long period a member of the Royal Cambrian Academy of Art, and in 1885, when the office of President was created, he was elected to the position, which he occupied until his death in 1912, and during his tenure of office he was assiduous in his efforts to promote the interests of the Academy.

With acknowledgments to the proprietors of *The Manchester City News* an appreciation of Mr. Whaite, published in that journal on the 28th January last, is reprinted here.

"Manchester has produced no artist whose works are more admired or whose character is more highly esteemed than Henry Clarence Whaite. He was born just a hundred years ago on January 27th, 1828, at 4, Bridge Street, Manchester, and he died at a ripe old age in 1912. His training was at the Manchester School of Art, under Mr. John Zephaniah Bell, and he began his career as a figure and decorative painter. We learn from an admirable little memoir published by his family (and from which we freely quote) that a visit to Switzerland, undertaken for the restoration of his health, showed him that his real

vocation lay in the field of landscape painting. The subsequent story of his life is that of an earnest and fruitful devotion to his art. He came under the influence of Ruskin and Turner, but remained free to interpret nature in accordance with the guiding of his own strongly marked individuality.

HONOURING GENIUS.

"He was for the greater part of his life a regular exhibitor at the Royal Academy and the Royal Water Colour Society, and in 1882 was elected a member of the latter institution. The Royal Cambrian Academy fitly recognised his fine interpretation of Welsh scenery by electing him their President, and the esteem in which he was held by his fellow artists in Manchester was shown by his election as President of the Manchester Academy of Fine Arts. The striking statue in bronze, the work of Mr. John Cassidy, was subscribed by his fellow citizens as a token of their high regard. When the King and Queen visited Conway Clarence Whaite was chosen to act as guide to their Royal Highnesses, and he carried out his duties with characteristic ease and dignity.

"We can fully endorse the tribute paid to Clarence Whaite that 'Nature found in him a rare interpreter of her manifold power and beauty. The strength of the hills, the trees and homesteads in the valley, he headlong torrent swirling and dashing amongst the rocks, the lake, the gently-flowing stream in the lowlands—all these, and many other scenes, are presented to us under widely differing and subtly rendered effects of light and shade, of calm and storm, and—with the frequency which tells of deep affection, and with wonderful skill—at the moment when the storm is passing away and the rainbow heralds the return of peace.'

PUBLIC SERVICE.

X. "In 1881, with the collaboration of a group of distinguished artists—W. Laurence Banks, Cuthbert C. Grundy, J. R. G. Grundy, Anderson Hague, E. A. Norbury and Charles Potter—

The initiator of the movement to establish an Academy for Wales was E. A. Norbury who was the first Chairman, & later, on

he founded the Royal Cambrian Academy of Art, and later, through the generosity of Lord Mostyn, secured the historic mansion of Plas Mawr, Conway, as the permanent home of the institution. The Society gathered into its fold a brilliant group of artists, including A. Baker, J. Pain Davis, John Finnie, George Harrison, George Hayes, J. C. Salmon, A. Slocombe and others, who worked hard and well as a fellowship for the development and advancement of Welsh art.

"Clarence Whaite died at his Welsh home, Tyddyn Cynal, Conway, on the 5th of June, 1912, in his 85th year, and was buried in the Churchyard of Llangelynnin, where his wife, who died some years before him, was also laid to rest."

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In Whaite being elected President, he was the Vice-President.
